What will the Apprentice study?

They will be working towards an NVQ level 2 and also a Technical Certificate at the same level. An NVQ is a National Vocational Qualification which allows employees to demonstrate that they have reached a competent level of knowledge and practical skills to do the job. The Technical Certificate is a theoretical qualification that supports the practical knowledge of the industry being worked in. Finally, the Apprentice may have to study Key Skills, dependant upon their GCSE results.

Entry Requirements

Ideally, the Apprentice will have attained GCSE's at Grade C or above in at Maths and English. They will also have to pass a CITB (Construction Industry Training Board) test.

Course Content

The main qualification is the **NVQ 2 in Trowel Occupations**, gained in the workplace. The Apprentice will build a portfolio of proof of competence, comprising of Witness testimony, photographs, direct observation & oral questioning. On their day release they will be studying the **Diploma in Brickwork** which is made up of the following:

Units

Mandatory

- Conform to General Workplace Safety
- Conform to efficient work practices
- Move and Handle Resources
- Erect Masonry Structures
- Set out Masonry Structures



Each student with complete a Health & Safety test to enable each to obtain their CSCS card and each student will also obtain an Abrasive Wheels Certificate.

Course Duration and Format

Normally 2 years, dependant on prior knowledge and experience. The Apprentice will spend 4 days in the workplace and attend College 1 day per week.

What support is available during the training?

A member of Tameside College Training will provide support and guidance throughout and will also visit both you and your Apprentice in the workplace every 8 weeks.

How do I apply for free training?

How much do I need to pay the Apprentice?

There are no set standards for wages. Levels will vary depending on the type of job and how much experience the Apprentice may already have. You will be expected to pay at least £95.00 a week.
