## What will the Apprentice study?

They will be working towards an NVQ level 3.

An NVQ (National Vocational Qualification) is a 'hands on' qualification that shows that you have the practical skills to do the job. Finally, the Apprentice may have to study Maths and/or English (Key Skills), dependant upon their GCSE results.

## Entry Requirements

The learner should already have completed their NVQ level 2 in Hairdressing.

Ideally, the Apprentice will have achieved GCSE's at Grade C or above in Maths and English.

## Course Content

The main qualification is the **City & Guilds NVQ3 in Hairdressing** gained in the workplace. The Apprentice will build a portfolio of proof of

evidence which will include written information about the learner's ability. It will also include direct observation and oral questioning.

On their day release they will be studying the

**City & Guilds Level 3: Hairdressing**, which is made up of the following:

### Units Practical Assessments

- Health & Safety For all units
- Consultation For all services
- Colour correction Correct tones to the hair
- Advanced Colouring Fashion Application
- Hair Extensions Add hair to full, partial head. Remove extensions
- Advanced Cutting New Fashion techniques
- Style & dress long Hair Advanced long hair work, competition work

For each unit the learner is required to pass the end tests and to complete the full examination.

## Course Duration and Format

Normally 1 years, dependant on prior knowledge and experience. The Apprentice will spend 4 days in the workplace and attend College 1 day per week.

## What support is available during the training?

A member of Tameside College Training will provide support and guidance throughout and will also visit both you and your Apprentice in the workplace every 8 weeks.

## How do I apply for free training?

## How much do I need to pay the Apprentice?

There is no set standard for wages. Levels of pay will vary depending on the type of job and how much experience the Apprentice already has. However, you will be expected to pay at least £95.00 per week.

## Progression

After the apprentice has had five years experience, they can progress on to an Assessors course or start Teacher Training.
