What will the Apprentice study?

They will be working towards an NVQ level 3 and also a Technical Certificate at the same level.

An NVQ is a National Vocational Qualification which allows employees to demonstrate that they have reached a competent level of knowledge and practical skills to do the job.

The Technical Certificate is a theoretical qualification that supports the practical knowledge of the industry being worked in.

Entry Requirements

The learner should already have completed their NVQ level 2 in Light Vehicle

Ideally, the Apprentice will have achieved GCSE's at Grade C or above in Maths and English

Course Content

The main qualification is the IMI Level 3 Certificate in Vehicle Maintenance & Repair: Light Vehicle. The Apprentice will compile a portfolio of proof of competence, comprising of Witness testimony, direct observation & oral questioning. There are 6 mandatory units and 5 optional units to choose from.

On their day release they will be studying the **Institute of the Motor industry (IMI) certificate**, which is made up of the following units:

Mandatory

- Contribute to Workplace Good Housekeeping
- Health & Safety
- Maintain Positive Working Relationships
- Diagnose and Rectify LV Engine & Components Faults
- Diagnose and Rectify LV chassis Systems Faults
- Diagnose and Rectify Auxiliary Equipment Electrical Faults

Optional

- Enable Learning through Demonstrations and Instructions
- Inspect Vehicles
- Identify and Agree Customer Vehicle Needs
- Overhaul Mechanical Units
- Diagnose and Rectify LV Transmissions and Driveline System Faults



Each unit has a multi choice test paper and to complete the full qualification they must pass an on-line examination.

Course Duration and Format

Normally 1 year, dependant on prior knowledge and experience. The Apprentice will spend 4 days in the workplace and attend College 1 day per week.

What support is available during the training?

A member of Tameside College Training will provide support and guidance throughout and will also visit both you and your Apprentice in the workplace every 8 weeks.

How do I apply for free training?

How much do I need to pay the Apprentice?

There are no set standards for wages. Levels will vary depending on the type of job and how much experience the Apprentice may already have. You will be expected to pay at least £95 a week.
